Hao Ren Hao Shi (好人好事)(HRHS) was founded by Mr Anson Ng in April 2018 with a simple premise: to distribute groceries to needy families living in Redhill Close. In collaboration with other charitable organizations, HRHS has grown organically to a much wider-reaching movement of community care and compassion across Singapore.

We've successfully expanded our activities and resources to reach a broader range of beneficiaries due to our growing team of dedicated volunteers. Today, we serve more than 30,000 individuals – including **low-income households, the terminally ill, persons with disabilities, migrant workers, and ex-offenders seeking a second chance.**

From our humble start, we've grown into a structured operation with a central warehouse serviced by a fleet of 6 vehicles. This year, we began our first fixed community location – Happy Mart at Stirling Road – and successfully planned for a second Happy Mart at Sengkang West Avenue.

Driven by our mission to support the underprivileged with essential supplies, we're also here to spark **kindness** and the **spirit of volunteering** in children, youth, and communities. Together, we're building a **more caring Singapore**—where hope is shared and no one is forgotten.

We also celebrated the official opening of our very first Happy Mart @Stirling on 4 January 2025. We are honoured to have the Minister for Education, Mr. Chan Chun Sing, as our Guest of Honour—a presence that not only elevated the occasion but also lent powerful affirmation to our mission. These community-focused spaces are more than just places to receive groceries—they are havens of dignity, joy, and hope. We are also on track to open our second Happy Mart @Fernvale in collaboration with Leong Nam Temple. All these projects could not have been made possible without the support from our generous donors and sponsors.

In FY24 we have organised over 120 sessions with primary schools, secondary schools and tertiary institutions, which reflects our strong emphasis on promoting volunteerism among our children and youth, allowing them to lead, bond and contribute back to society.

We have reached more than 21,000 individuals and families—including low-income households, the terminally ill, persons with disabilities, migrant workers, and ex-offenders rebuilding their lives. Every story, every smile, and every word of thanks reaffirms our belief that no act of kindness is ever too small.

At the heart of what we do is our unwavering commitment to serve. To support this growth, we have strengthened our infrastructure. Today, we operate a central warehouse and a fleet of six vehicles, allowing us to meet logistical demands and power our mobile grocery distribution efforts across the island.





HRHS served a total of 21,699 beneficiaries in 2024 through our Mobile Groceries (MG), Toa Payoh Distribution and Happy Mart @Stirling.

Our Initiatives

As the cost of living continues to rise, many vulnerable families in our community are finding it harder than ever to cope. At HRHS, we believe that our core initiatives – such as the Toa Payoh Distribution, Mobile Groceries (MG), and Happy Mart (launched in October 2024) – offer vital support, delivered with the convenience and dignity our beneficiaries deserve.

Toa Payoh Distribution



Toa Payoh Distribution, is conducted on the 1st Saturday of every month. Items are pre-packed by volunteers at a centralised location and sent to the beneficiaries staying at different parts of Singapore via our volunteer drivers.

Mobile Groceries



HRHS Mobile Groceries (MG), a pioneering programme that delivers essential provisions to the communities in need, bringing convenience, joy and hope.

Happy Mart



Happy Mart is a mini-mart-style provision centre that offers our beneficiaries a convenient and dignified way to select the items they need—promoting choice, respect, and joy in the process.

Our Initiatives – Toa Payoh Distribution*

On the first Saturday of every month, HRHS, together with our dedicated logistics champions, mobilises around 15 lorries and over 300 volunteers at Blocks 158, 159, and 160 Toa Payoh Lorong 1.

Together, we unload and pack more than 18 different essential items and groceries, ready to be delivered directly to individual families in need. Each distribution drive serves about 1000 beneficiaries, located across Singapore.

Our Initiatives – Mobile Groceries

Our pioneering Mobile Groceries programme is dedicated to easing the daily financial burden of vulnerable communities across Singapore. By delivering essential provisions in a manner that prioritizes convenience and dignity, we ensure accessibility for those who need it most. Our innovative approach has gained remarkable traction, leading to a surge in popularity and demand—resulting in a twofold increase in distribution sessions compared to 2023.

Starting from 1 April 2024, HRHS has partnered with South West CDC to support 7,200 families in the South West district for the next two years, providing \$300,000 worth of groceries. The initiative was officially launched by Minister for Trade and Industry, Mr Gan Kim Yong and Mayor of South West District, Ms Low Yen Ling.

Our Initiatives – Happy Mart

Happy Mart @Stirling is **HRHS's first "shop-for-free" mini-mart**, designed to support nearby residents-in-need. Each beneficiary will receive 12 credits each month, which can be redeemed for a thoughtfully curated selection. We are grateful to **TAK Products and Services Pte Ltd** for sponsoring the renovation and the first batch of provision for the pilot launch of the mart on 20th October 2024.

These include everyday staples such as rice, canned goods, cooking oil, and condiments, alongside necessities like adult diapers, sanitary products, and cleaning supplies. Additionally, freshly roasted chicken and cakes are available, allowing families to celebrate special occasions with dignity and warmth. Beyond the credit-based system, free-of-charge items are also included at every distribution session, ensuring extra support for those who need it most.

We like to deeply appreciate our committed team of volunteers who operate Happy Mart every Wednesday and Sunday, ensuring smooth operations and a welcoming environment for all.




